#### WELCOME TO THE 'SCHOOLS MUSIC SERVICE'

Pupils this week attended a music assembly from the 'Schools Music Service'. During the assembly they learned what music lessons are on offer to them.

The S.M.S provides quality music education and support in schools and in the community. Established in 1997, they provide tuition for over 2000 children in schools throughout the North West and to pupils of all ages in various music centres.

Group rate tuition fees are based on around 3 pupils sharing a half hour lesson. There are 10 lessons per term, totalling 30 lessons per academic year. The cost is  $\pounds 6.60$  per lesson,  $\pounds 66.00$  per term, a total of  $\pounds 198.00$  per year. Parents may pay in advance or by 10 monthly instalments of  $\pounds 19.80$ .

Please note that the School Music Service is an external company who would manage all bookings and payments directly with families.
