To our families,

Zoe's Place baby hospice which is part of our community will be closing its doors in December. Over 50 families will lose the service that provides 1:1 care for children aged 0-5 with complex and life-limiting needs.

The families and staff need the support of everyone to stop this from happening, this is the only baby hospice in Liverpool and for a lot of families there is no other support.

The hospice needs to raise 5 million pounds by the end of October to remain open.

The benefits include; saving you time booking a GP appointment plus free confidential advice and where suitable treatment from your Pharmacist. The Seven conditions covered in the scheme are as follows:

- sinusitis (for adults and children aged 12 years and over)
- sore throat (for adults and children aged 5 years and over)
- earache (for adults and children aged 1 to 17 years)
- shingles (for adults aged 18 years and over)
- impetigo (non-bullous, for adults and children aged 1 year and over)
- infected insect bites (for adults and children aged 1 year and over)
- uncomplicated urinary tract infection in women (aged 16-64)
